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IT IS GOD'S PURPOSE

A purpose is the reason for which something exists. It is important to know that God created heaven and earth for a purpose. Nothing exists without God's purpose. This means the tiny grain of sand at the seashore exists for a purpose. How much more you? Therefore, your purpose is the true meaning of your life. In Genesis 1:26-28, God talks about creating men in His image and likeness. There is a purpose for that; it is so He can fellowship with us. But He knew we needed to survive on this earth. He made the earth habitable to provide all that we need to remain alive.

Jeremiah 1:5

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; Before you were born I sanctified you; I ordained you a prophet to the nations."

It is true of every person on earth that God knew us before we were born. It is true that beyond the general purpose as seen in Genesis 1:27–28, God commanded us to be fruitful, multiply, replenish the earth, and have dominion. There was a specific intention in God's heart for us when He created us. That intention and purpose are what we describe as God's purpose for you.

In Jeremiah 1:5, God speaks to Jeremiah about his specific purpose: to be a prophet to the nations. This is a sequence in the scriptures where God sends angels to talk to parents about His purpose for the child they are about to bear. This happened with Samson, Jacob, John the Baptist, and Jesus. In God's purpose for you, there is an assignment or accomplishment that He destined for you to do; there is a geographical location on the earth that He wants you to impact; and there are certain people whose needs He wants to meet through you.

If your purpose is first God's purpose, it means that you must discover your purpose in Him. In Jeremiah 1:2, Jeremiah is described as the one to whom God's word came. Furthermore, in verse 4, he says of himself "Then the word of the Lord came to me". There seems to be a sequence in scripture where God does the first reaching out. In fact, for the redemption of the world, it was God who came to us in human flesh. God is not a careless creator. He first reaches out to establish a relationship with His creation, so He can navigate us towards the real essence of our lives. Much more than we are, God is willing to reveal His purpose for our lives to us.

Do you have a relationship with God? If yes, how deep or strong is it? If not, it is not too late for you. The first step towards having a relationship with God is to be saved. How can you be saved?

Romans 10:8

But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): Romans 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. (NKJV)

You have to put the horse before the cart. You must be born again by believing in your heart that Jesus died for your sins and was raised to life the third day for your justification, and you must confess the same with your mouth.

At salvation, you experience the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. This is God indwelling you. This means that you have 24/7 direct access to God. This is the closest we can get to God—being indwelt by Him. He comes into us to work out His will and pleasures through us.

Philippians 2:13 for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure. (NKJV)

It is in this that we begin to experience the communion of the Holy Spirit. We then begin to hear Him talk to us in our hearts and through the revelation of the scriptures. Because He is the spirit of wisdom and revelation. Then He begins to draw our hearts towards yearning to know the Lord. As we know the Lord, we encounter Him, and He reveals to us our true identity in Him.

DISCOVERING GOD'S PURPOSE

It is worthy of note that almost everyone in the Bible who had an encounter with God simultaneously discovered God's purpose for them. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Peter, and Paul, among others. It might look like all these men are patriarchs of faith. You might mistake what I am saying now for meaning that God is only interested in you, so you will be doing the work of the ministry. However, we must remember that Peter was a fisherman, the Apostle Paul was a tentmaker, and Jacob was a successful farmer. All these men had a source of income. Therefore, God is interested in your wellbeing, and He supports that you work with your hands. But God's purpose for your life is not confined only to what you do to earn money.

Let us first understand that God's purpose for you is different from your career path, business, or source of income. God's purpose is the specific impact He wants to make in the lives of others through you. You notice in Acts Chapter 9 that when Jesus encountered Paul, he was employed! Paul was a teacher of the laws of Moses in the Jewish religion. He was working for the High Priest of those days to persecute the Christians, and he was very passionate about it. This means God's purpose is not merely what you are passionate about. You cannot determine God's purposes for your life by what you are skilled at or what brings you money. To do so is to put the cart before the horse.

The most important thing to know about God's purpose for you is that He will tell you His purpose for your life. He will tell you in clear terms. How do you hear from God? You hear from God primarily through His Spirit in your heart. When you pray to Him, He will speak to you. God is constantly communicating His purpose for us to our ears. The problem is that many people are not ready to listen. They are first concerned with their material needs. See what Jesus says:

Matthew 6:31-33

"Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'. For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. (NKJV)

The second requirement for discovering God's purpose for our lives is that we must have a correct heart posture in our relationship with God. We must prioritize God's kingdom. This is because God's purpose for your life is fundamentally and eternally relevant. This means God's purpose for you is your specific assignment, through which you will populate and establish God's kingdom on the earth.

Many people come to God for what they will eat, wear, or drink. God is merciful; He will give it to them. But such people will continue to seek these things because they do not satisfy the hunger of our soul. The sad reality is that the more they seek these things, the less sensitive their souls become towards receiving God's purpose for their lives. So, understanding God's purpose for our lives requires more than just having a relationship with God; it requires having a heart that desires His desires, that longs for God's longings, and that delights in the things that delight Him.

The key ingredient to discovering God's purpose for your life is to seek first the Kingdom of God, which is to populate it and establish it here on earth. This is the summary of God's purpose for us. This is why, when Jesus, the physical image of God's person on earth, would leave the world and ascend to heaven, the mandate he gave the disciples was to go into the world, preach the gospel to every creature, and make disciples of all nations."

Therefore, if you're going to be a doctor, a lecturer, or an accountant, whatever it is that is your career or source of income, it will be a platform through which God fulfils His purpose through you.

BELIEVING GOD'S PURPOSE FOR YOU

Jeremiah 1:5-8

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." "Alas, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young." But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am too young.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD. [NIV]

There is usually this phase in the lives of God's children who have a walk with God. It is one in which we dialogue with God about His purpose for us. Jeremiah, in sincerity of heart, exclaimed to God in response to the revelation of purpose that he couldn't speak because he was a youth. This phase is a common occurrence in the lives of patriarchs of faith. We can see this in Abraham and Sarah. God kept talking to them about His purpose for their lives; it was illogical to the senses to think an old woman and an old man would come together to deliver a child through whom an entire nation would emerge, and through this nation, the saviour of the world (Jesus) would come.

Likewise, this phase is seen in the life of Moses in Exodus 3 and 4. He was a stammerer, so he considered himself unqualified to bring the Israelites out of Egypt. God had to keep sending His word to him to convince him to believe and accept God's purpose for him. Same with Peter and the other apostles. Jesus, in His earthly walk, was bringing them into understanding God's purpose for their lives. In understanding it, God addresses our doubts, fears, selfish ambitions, and shortcomings.

If your purpose is something you can accomplish without God's help, it is most likely not God's purpose for your life. God's purpose is bigger than you. God's purpose can only be received through faith. Most times, it seems unachievable to the senses.

The disciples, after spending over 3 years with Jesus, still had to go through this phase after his resurrection. They left their God-given purpose to go fishing. But Jesus had to come again to them. Most people delay yielding to God's purpose for their lives due to fear of what people will say, of the price they will pay, or of their deficiencies.

John 21:3-4

Simon Peter said to them, I go a fishing. They say to him, We also go with you. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and that night they caught nothing. But when the morning was now come, Jesus stood on the shore: but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus.[AKJV]

It is very understandable what the state of the disciples was at this very point. They had been discouraged because of the death of Jesus. They knew they were to continue the ministry of Jesus on earth. He had prepared them for this phase. They knew they were going to do something other than fish. But they went fishing instead. Many people enter this phase of life when the only logical thing to do is pursue the work that will feed them and their families at the expense of God's purpose for their lives. Sometimes, we are so worried that we try to take responsibility for our own welfare rather than trust God to take care of us.

For some people, this phase can span months, years, or decades; for me, it took me over two years to begin CharisFolks. During that time, I knew vaguely what I needed to do for my purpose. But I was not stable enough to start out, emotionally or financially. I had been healing from the pain I felt as a result of my mom's demise. You see, you cannot go into fulfilling your purpose effectively when you're emotionally unwell. When you are still holding grudges against someone who hurt you in the past or when you're still taunted by guilt from your past mistakes.

For the disciples, it was so bad that they could not recognise Jesus even after spending over 3 years closely walking and relating with Him. The place of believing God's purpose is crucial to fulfilling God's purpose. It is in this phase that God puts things in place in our lives to prepare us for His purpose. You will be amazed at how Jesus handled the situation with the disciples.

John 21:5-6

Then Jesus said to them, Children, have you any meat? They answered him, No. And he said to them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and you shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.[AKJV]

He first addressed their physical needs at that moment. He gave them a miracle so He could draw their attention to Himself. Jesus will bring you your healing; he will give you a good job; He will give you a good spouse; think of any material or physical need that you may be seeking; He can provide it! So, rather than holding their unbelief or digression from His plan and purpose and their mistakes against them, He addressed the problem from the source. He gave them abundantly what they needed. It was in this encounter that the disciples had a revelation of Jesus that made them run back to Him with so much joy.

John 21:7-8

Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt his fisher's coat to him, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea. And the other disciples came in a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes. [AKJV]

Now we see two different reactions. The first is Peter swimming towards Jesus. He left the multitude of fish they had caught, left the boat (or convenience), and swam towards Jesus in the cold and muddy water. Our belief in God's purpose can cause us to run towards Jesus without any attachment to our material possessions. Unlike the rich young ruler who was so attached to his material possessions, he couldn't sell it all and give the money to the poor so that he could serve Jesus. We must not stay with the fish; we must not stay with the miracles and forget Jesus. We must not idolize the miracle, the fame, the money, or the breakthrough. Jesus is simply giving them to us so that He can have our attention. The moment we follow that path of idolizing Mamon, it is difficult to be restored. Material things do not satisfy the yearnings of the soul; they only cause the soul to plunge deeper and deeper into greed and selfishness. The second reaction is that of the other disciples, who came in a little ship, dragging the net with fish along with them. There are a set of people who prefer to serve God using the breakthrough, influence, wealth, and health that He gave them. Some will choose to be financial partners in the spreading of the gospel rather than actual missionaries. Well, there is nothing wrong with that, as long as these things don't take over your heart. You must be sure you are not dragging the net of fish towards Jesus because you are careful about what you will eat tomorrow. You must be sure that your focus is still on the source of the provision, which is God, and not the provision alone.

John 21:9-11

As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid thereon, and bread. Jesus said to them, Bring of the fish which you have now caught. Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.[AKJV]

Did you notice that as soon as they got to the land, there was food already waiting for them? This means that the disciple Peter, who left everything behind and swam towards Jesus, did not lose in the end. You see, there is nothing you give up in your pursuit of Jesus and doing His will that you will regret giving up. Then He tells them to bring out the fish they caught, meaning we are expected to serve God with our bodies when healing happens and with our money if we land a high-income job. Our miracles should be a tool we use to serve God. Did you also notice that the net did not break as they brought the fish to Jesus? This means that whatever you dedicate to Jesus, He will surely preserve. I tell you the truth today: Jesus is worth living for! A life in Christ is a life free of regrets.

John 21:12-14

Jesus said to them, Come and dine. And none of the disciples dared ask him, Who are you? knowing that it was the Lord. Jesus then comes, and takes bread, and gives them, and fish likewise. This is now the third time that Jesus showed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.[AKJV] It seems as though Jesus will not give up convincing you about His plans for your life. He will keep reminding you as often as possible. Proving to you his capacity to take care of you. Addressing your questions and fears as often as He can. We see Him calling them to dine with Him. He wants them to fellowship with Him. I often say that conviction is birthed in the place of prayer, and you need conviction to run the race that God has set for you. You need conviction to pursue and keep pursuing God's purpose for you. But may I encourage you to tarry no longer and yield to the calling of God? Yield to the invitation He keeps stretching towards you about His plans and purpose for you.

John 21:15-17

So when they had dined, Jesus said to Simon Peter, Simon, son of Jonas, love you me more than these? He said to him, Yes, Lord; you know that I love you. He said to him, Feed my lambs. He said to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, love you me? He said to him, Yes, Lord; you know that I love you. He said to him, Feed my sheep. He said to him the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, love you me? Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, Love you me? And he said to him, Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you. Jesus said to him, Feed my sheep.[AKJV]

Jesus then begins to question Peter's love for Him. Jesus needed to be sure that He would not always have to supply material needs to catch Peter's attention. That he will love Him who is the provider, and not the things provided. Our love for Jesus is the essential motivation to follow His purpose for us. We must serve Him because we love Him, not because of the miracles He does. This love must consume our hearts and draw us to serve Him.

FULFILLING GOD'S PURPOSE FOR YOU

Acts 1:8

But you shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come on you: and you shall be witnesses to me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and to the uttermost part of the earth.[AKJV]

Jesus picks people who were timid, discouraged, and about to return to their previous source of livelihood only to begin talking to them about a global ministry. Jesus began to tell them about going to the world to preach the gospel and raise disciples for Him, with signs and wonders following. If you are a child of God, your purpose will revolve around these two things: preaching the gospel and raising disciples for Jesus Christ. Some people say that this instruction was given to the apostles alone, but I put it to you that it applies to us today.

2 Corinthians 5:17-19

Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. And all things are of God, who has reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and has given to us the ministry of reconciliation; To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, not imputing their trespasses to them; and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. [AKJV]

Did you notice the Bible says "any man"? The prerequisite to being given the ministry of reconciliation is to be "any man in Christ". We were made a new creature with divine nature and capabilities so that we could take up the responsibility of reconciling others to God.

The new creature is a kind of human race that did not exist until the resurrection of Jesus. He is God's workmanship, handiwork, or masterpiece, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God had predestined that we walk in (Eph. 2:10). Well, one peculiar thing about this new creature is that he is in the nature of God. This man can comprehend the things of God. Therefore, the new creature can fellowship and commune with God. He can develop an intimate relationship with God in which he talks to God and God talks to him. Please note that the new creature includes both males and females. The new creature is God's likeness in nature and character; this refers first to the spirit man. The day you got saved, your spirit, or inner man, became born anew, having God's nature and DNA. Although your body stayed the same, you didn't grow taller or thinner on the day you were born again. Likewise, your mind did not change; you did not automatically forget all the things you knew prior to the time you got saved. But a significant change happened to the real you on the inside of your body—that is, the spirit man, or your inner man. The new creature has three major responsibilities: to have an intimate relationship with God, to love people with the selfless love of God, and to reign in life above the devil.

"...and has given to us the ministry of reconciliation..."

The word "ministry" refers to service or actual work. This "ministry" of reconciliation is simply the work of ministering the word of reconciliation, which is the gospel. Everything else done aside from this is to compliment this ministry. Being a teacher, prophet, apostle, pastor, or financial partner with Christian ministries all points towards either reconciling men to God or training people to go and reconcile men to God. This is God's purpose for you. You only need to find your specific role in this broad work. Is God's purpose for you to plant like Paul or to water like Apollos? or to partner financially with the ministry of reconciliation, like Mary Magdalene. Ultimately, God's purpose for you must find its root in the scriptures.

Acts 1:8

But you shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come on you: and you shall be witnesses to me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and to the uttermost part of the earth.[AKJV]

Prior to Acts 1:8, Jesus had begun to speak with the Apostles in Luke 24:48–49, where He spoke to them of being endued with power from on high after He sent the promise of the Father (the Holy Spirit) unto them. Why is Jesus so emphatic about power? The word "power" is from the Greek word "dunamis" which means "ability". This was the same word translated "virtue" in Luke 8:46, which documents the story of the woman who had a sickness that caused blood to keep flowing out of her body; she got healed immediately after she touched the cloth that Jesus was wearing. Jesus then replied, saying "Somebody has touched me:;for I perceive that virtue (dunamis) is gone out from me".

The word "dunamis" signifies supernatural ability. Our purpose as Christians is, summarily, to be witnesses of Jesus. Witnesses of Jesus are people who tell others about Jesus either by talking to them about Him or by demonstrating Him to them. To tell others about Jesus means to preach the gospel to them. The gospel is the good news of Jesus' crucifixion, burial, resurrection, and ascension to the right hand of God.

1 Corinthians 15:1-4

Moreover, brothers, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you have received, and wherein you stand; By which also you are saved, if you keep in memory what I preached to you, unless you have believed in vain. For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures: [AKJV]

The gospel is God's good news for the entire human race. Jesus has paid the death price for our sins, and by believing in Him and confessing Him as Lord, we will be saved from having to die for our sins again. Death in this context speaks primarily of spiritual death. This is spiritual separation from God, that is, a point where man's spirit is not connected to God anymore. Remember in Genesis chapter 1, when God wanted to create vegetation, he spoke to the ground? Also, when He wanted to create the fish, He spoke to the waters to bring them forth. Have you noticed that, ideally, a plant cannot survive when it is uprooted from the ground? Likewise, a fish cannot survive when it is extracted from the water. Similarly, when He was to create man, He spoke to Himself, breathed His life into man's nostrils, and made him a living soul (Genesis 2:7). This means that, as humans, our source and natural habitat are in God. However, when Adam sinned, he became separated from God, which makes man vulnerable to corruption, infirmities, and death. This continued to be man's state until the redemptive works of Jesus were fulfilled and the price of sin was fully paid. Today, it is by believing the gospel that we can benefit from the redemptive works of Jesus and be saved, for the gospel is the power of God unto salvation. How will people believe the gospel unless they hear it? How will they hear it unless someone preaches it to them? We cannot afford to substitute this ministry of reconciliation with something else. Not philanthropy, not working miracles, not building beautiful church auditoriums, etc. These things are good, but they must not replace the actual ministry of reconciliation, which involves the preaching of the word of reconciliation, which is the gospel.

Romans 1:15-17

So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also. For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God to salvation to every one that believes; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith. [AKJV]

Can I invite you to come out of your timidity today? Can you take up your duty as a witness of Jesus and preach the gospel? Can you stop being ashamed of preaching the gospel? For in your preaching of the gospel, God has put "His power unto salvation". It is as though there are certain people who will not hear the gospel all their lives if you do not preach it to them. It is as though these people will miss the chance of being saved and be doomed to perish if you do not preach. The requirement for being a minister of reconciliation is to be a new creature that is to be born again. The requirement for being a new creature is to believe the gospel. You don't need to be a pastor, a bishop, a missionary, or a priest.

You must note that you need more than self-motivation to step out and be consistent and successful in the fulfillment of your purpose; you also need supernatural ability and strength. All these were supplied to you the moment you received the Holy Spirit. You receive the Holy Spirit the moment you believe the gospel and are saved. This means that you cannot fulfill God's purpose for your life without the supernatural power that the Holy Spirit supplies to you. Did you notice in Acts Chapter 2 that after the Holy Ghost came upon the Apostles, they were able to pray and boldly preach the gospel?

Acts 1:8

But you shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come on you: and you shall be witnesses to me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and to the uttermost part of the earth. [AKJV]

There were two major things that Jesus gave to the apostles after His resurrection to equip them for their purpose. The first were revelational teachings from the scriptures about Himself, which addressed their unbelief and prepared their hearts to receive the Holy Ghost. The second was the Holy Spirit, who enabled them to do the things required of them in fulfilling God's purpose. Today, we receive the Holy Spirit at salvation; then comes the experience of the baptism of the Holy Spirit, which allows us to function boldly and effectively in the gifts of the Spirit. The Spirit's primary role in our lives is to aid us in having an intimate relationship with God. Then, He aids us in effectively ministering for God and fulfilling His purpose. Therefore, the Holy Spirit works first on us so that we can effectively fulfill God's purpose for our lives.

The first thing the baptism of the Holy Spirit accomplishes in our lives is a strong prayer life. Because of this, the Apostles' first manifestation of the gift of the spirit was that they started speaking in tongues as the spirit gave them utterance (Acts 2:4). 1 Corinthians 14:2 says anyone who speaks in tongues speaks to God. This is significant in our lives as well; the Holy Spirit helps us draw nearer to God in fellowship.

The next thing that you notice is that people were drawn to them. As we grow in our intimate relationship with God through the Holy Spirit, He begins to bring people around us and create opportunities for us to be sources of blessing to them. Peter then spoke boldly to the people. He used the opportunity that had been presented to them effectively, and 3000 souls were saved that day. Our journey in purpose fulfillment may not be exactly like that of the Apostles, but it will follow this pattern: salvation, an intimate relationship with God or a strong personal prayer life, being in the right local church and company of Christians, then opportunities to be a blessing to others in whatever capacity God has endowed you with will come, and then you will take responsibility to maximize such opportunities either in your school, office, or local church.

I encourage you today to not just live through life for yourself. Don't let your life be all about your own ambitions and desires; seek to understand God's purpose for your life and fulfill it.

CONCLUSION

If you are not saved, I want you to know that you cannot be filled with the Holy Spirit without being born again, and you cannot fulfill God's purpose for your life without the Holy Spirit. What you need to do to be saved is believe that Jesus died for your sins, was buried, and rose up on the third day for your justification. This is the gospel! If you believe, confess these words: "Lord Jesus, I believe that you died for my sins and resurrected the third day for my justification; I repent from my sins and confess you as my Lord; therefore, all my sins have been blotted out, and the Holy Spirit now dwells in my heart. Amen". Congratulations! You are now a child of God and on your way to fulfilling God's purpose for your life.

If you are saved and desire to experience the baptism of the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in tongues, I want you to know that the only requirement for you to experience this is to be indwelt by the Holy Spirit, which makes you a child of God, and to desire this experience. Now, prayerfully say these words: "Father, I thank you for the redemptive work of Jesus; I thank you for saving me and making me your child; right now, I believe that the Holy Spirit is in and upon me; I am filled with the Holy Spirit; therefore, I can pray to God in tongues, and I will pray to God with tongues now. Amen". Now, go ahead and begin to pray to God in tongues. There you go! Keep praying to God in tongues. Keep praying!
